Prayer of Confession (lay person)

Lay Person: O God, you have created us to depend on one another. If we do not work together, we will tear the world apart. You have made us debtors to those who have gone before us; if we do not learn from them, we will cripple the world for those who will come after us. You have bestowed on us gifts to make us one. If we do not share them, we will not reach the better world toward which you would lead us. We praise you for entrusting us with so great a responsibility.

If only our faith were as great as your trust! But our record, at best, has been spotted. Instead of depending on others to work for the good, we have simply neglected them. Instead of learning from the experience of previous generations, we have repeated their mistakes. Instead of sharing your gifts according to need, we have simply hoarded them. Instead of pursuing the healing you desire for us, we have participated in brokenness.

All: For this betrayal of you, we ask for forgiveness, O God. Not only have we betrayed you as a people, we have betrayed you as individuals.
