Kits for Conference

It's time to assemble kits for Annual Conference which begins on June 11. Containers will be in the hallway by the narthex through June 4 for you to drop off your kits. If a monetary donation is preferred, please put it in the UMW box.

- **Flood Buckets**

- A 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid
- Bleach (two 1-quart or one 82 ounce bottle. Do not include bleach if you are shipping the bucket through the U.S. Postal Service, UPS or FedEx.)
- 5 scouring pads
- 7 sponges
- One scrub brush
- 18 cleaning towels (reusable wipes)
- Liquid laundry detergent (two 25 ounce or one 50 ounce bottle)
- One household cleaner (12-16 ounce bottle)
- Disinfectant dish soap (16-28 ounce bottle)
- 50 clothes pins
- Clothes line (two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.)
- Five dust masks
- Two pair latex gloves
- One pair work gloves
- 24 bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45 gallon—remove roll before placing in bucket)
- One insect repellent spray (6-14 ounce can—if aerosol, cans must have protective caps)
- One air freshener (8 or 9 ounce can—if aerosol, cans must have protective caps)
- Put all items in the plastic bucket and seal lid.
- If you prefer, a donation of \$45 plus \$1.50 for shipping can be made.

- **Bedding Packs**

- Two flat double-bed sheets
- Two pillowcases
- Two pillows

If you prefer, a donation of \$50 plus \$1.00 for shipping can be made.

School Kits

- One pair of blunt scissors
- Pads or notebooks of ruled paper 8 1/2 x 11 containing 150-200 sheets of paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler (12")
- One pencil sharpener
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One large eraser
- Twelve sheets of varied colors construction paper
- One box of 24 crayons
- One 12 x 13 inch cloth bag with cloth handles and velcro, snap or button closure.

Pack these items in the cloth bag and secure contents with the closure.
