Say a prayer before you read the scripture verses, asking God to speak to you through the Word. Read each passage aloud - more than once, if you feel so led. Allow some time for silent reflection upon each passage, providing God an opportunity to speak to you. Keep a journal of your thoughts about each passage. Conclude with prayer.
