Some days more than one activity is going on. The biggest reason I am stepping down is that I'm feeling called to do other things. I'm not leaving the congregation – I've already let the Lay Leadership Committee know where I'd be willing to continue helping conduct God's plan for Warwick Memorial. Let's demonstrate our support as this team goes in the name of Jesus, our Great and Powerful Healer.

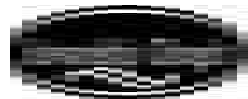
