You may place your donations in the container in the Celebration Center.

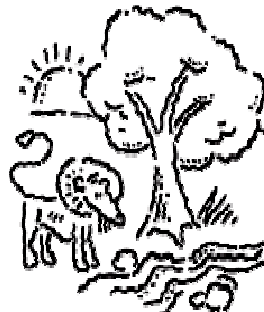
