### New Bible Study - The Old Testament For Beginners

Later this month, the **Covenant Sunday School Class** (meeting in the Celebration Center) will begin a new Bible study on the Old Testament. Well-known educator Don Griggs has written an accessible, non-threatening introduction to the Bible for adults who have—or fear that they have—little or no biblical knowledge. In this study of the Old Testament, Griggs walks us through the Bible, hitting the highlights and providing a clear and useful overview. Many of us spend very little time studying the Old Testament, but it's hard to fully understand the New Testament without some understanding of the Old. Do you know the four major sources of the Old Testament? Do you know why there are two creation stories in Genesis? Do you understand the history of the Old Testament and how it came into being? We spend a lot of time in discussion, so you have the opportunity to hear from many different perspectives. If this study sounds interesting to you, please come and join us on Sunday morning.

The Care Net Resource Pregnancy Centers' *2009 Baby Bottle Campaign* is underway from October 11 to November 15. It's as simple as 1, 2, and 3...this is all you have to do:

1. Get your empty baby bottle from Gail Slocum after 8:30 service or in the Celebration Center Sunday school room.
2. Fill it with your spare change, bills, or check made payable to CRPC.
3. Return the filled baby bottle by November 15 to Gail Slocum or the church office.

**Remember: Your change changes lives!**

Here's a sample of what your “change” will provide:

- 15 dimes = a pregnancy test
- 25 nickels = an abstinence, pregnancy, or adoption brochure
- 34 quarters = a post-abortion Bible study book (We do not refer or advocate abortion, only provide information on the risks involved. CRPC offers hope and healing through Jesus Christ for a past abortion.)
- \$25 = a training manual for a volunteer peer counselor
