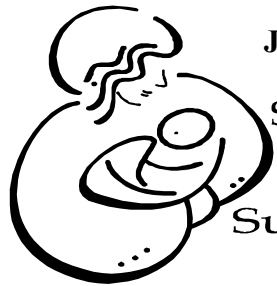

This important day also provides an opportunity for pregnancy centers such as **Care Net** to share about the work they do to bring life-affirming resources to their communities and to empower women and men to choose life for their unborn children.
