Is there a room in your home where family members frequently forget to turn off lights as they leave? Now there are "dimmer" switches that double as occupancy sensors, turning lights off and on automatically as you enter and exit a room. One brand (the Lutron Maestro Occupancy Sensor) is available at Home Depot and Lowes, and less expensive versions can also be found online. You are the bread; You are the Bread of Life, take and eat, never hunger again.

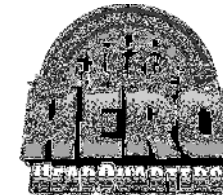
