### Basketball and Outreach

Kevin Brown of Operation Breaking Through met with a group of businessmen who wanted to establish a model for churches to do outreach to gangs in their local community. The idea is to schedule a **weekly basketball outreach** targeting these groups. These are the most needy and are outside of Christian leagues. There would be a time to share the Bible and witness and then play basketball from 9:00 to 11:30 p.m. (critical time when gang activity is going on).

Greg Garrett runs this model program in Seaford and is willing to set one up in Denbigh for a church to take over. In the Seaford League, there are 15-25 men ages 16-32 who play.

We need at least three men to volunteer to run this ministry one night a week. We are not asking for a commitment at this point. We just need to know who might be interested. Once we find out the interest, we will go out to Seaford on a Thursday to see how their ministry works. After that, we will have Greg Garrett come and talk to us. ### **Farm Fresh Receipts**

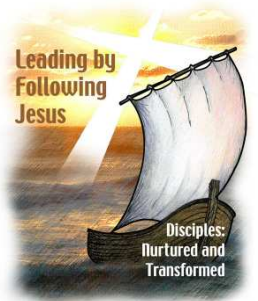
