Message this Week Based on Matthew 20:1-16

This week's parable - like all parables - is not really about laborers or wages any more than the others are about sheep and goats. This is a story about God's goodness, His patience and forgiveness, and the Atonement of the Lord Jesus Christ. It is a story about generosity and compassion. It is a story about grace. It underscores the thought that the thing God enjoys most about being God is the thrill of being merciful, especially to those who don't expect it and often feel they don't deserve it.

We do not know who may need to hear the message of forgiveness inherent in this parable, but however late you think you are, however many chances you think you have missed, however many mistakes you feel you have made or talents you think you don't have, or however far from home and family and God you feel you have traveled, I testify that you have *not* traveled beyond the reach of divine love. It is not possible for you to sink lower than the infinite light of Christ's Atonement shines.

The Master's reward in the Final Judgment will not be based on how long we have labored in the vineyard. We do not obtain our heavenly reward by punching a time clock. What is essential is that our labors in the workplace of the Lord have caused us to *become* something. For some of us, this requires a longer time than for others. What is important in the end is what we have become by our labors.

So if you have made covenants, keep them. If you haven't made them, make them. If you have made them and broken them, repent and repair them. It is *never* too late so long as the Master of the vineyard says there is time. ... don't delay. It's getting late.

Something good happens every week - come and see for yourself and bring a friend!




Men's Fraternity Bible Study

Why A Called Church Conference, October 10th at 5:30pm.

This church conference is for our church membership to vote yes or no on pulling funds from our initial endowment account. The initial investment was \$173,000. Over the years, we have used funds from the earnings of this money for various different things: mission trip grants, educational grants and once or twice we have used it to help balance our operating budget.

Post-Covid we have struggled a little to get ourselves back on our feet with the increase in various expenses like electric, gas, general maintenance supplies for the facility and every day items used within the church (postage, paper, toilet paper, soap, common store items, etc.) We placed an income line into the 2023 budget to use funds from the endowment earnings. As of the end of September, we have not had to use those funds but as we move towards the end of the year and annual expenditures hit our budget, we may need to rely on some or all of that amount—the less we use in 2023, the more that will be available to help in 2024. However, if we base our 2024 budget on the 2023 budget, the known income will be short approximately \$80,000. Known income is the pledge gifts, non-pledge gifts from known givers, rental income, facility use income, etc. We do not expect to have a roll-over of funds as we have most years in the past. Technically, the devastation of Covid has caught up with our church. We have lost a number of members to moving away to be closer to family, passing away, or changing churches for various reasons.

We have gained new members over the past 2 years, post-covid we have had 2 successful confirmation classes and brought 5 youth into membership, some past members have returned and transferred their membership back to us. Our Dinner Church and Meals on Monday programs are bringing new people to our church and to our events – we ARE growing, we ARE a prospering church. Support for the Red Bird mission trip and Honduras mission trip, our Rise Against Hunger meal packaging event, the support to upgrade our Celebration Center audio visual and lighting equipment, and much more are all funded with very generous second mile giving – funds that are given from the heart and not through our operating budget – our Family Life and Operating Fund.

As you heard from Henry a few weeks ago, we have over \$400,000 in various K Accounts for different missions and ministry programs within our church — wow! This operating budget shortfall is a temporary set-back. We are rebuilding, but, to continue our growth, we may need to use funds not only from the earnings of our endowment account, but also some of the initial endowment fund, possibly as much as \$32,000. If we do have to use it, we pray it will be a one-time need and this will prevent us from needing to make any drastic changes to our Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) budget, which could mean cutting down to one pastor, and reducing other staff members' hours/salaries. This will not help us to continue with our recovery and could be very detrimental to the overall health of our church.

We are not doing this to scare you. As you know, we are a very strong, loving, supportive church, but sadly, rising costs of various things that our church uses on a daily basis and post-covid recovery, have caused us to get to this position. Ultimately, our goal is to be self-sustaining again, with more church members/supporters and more tithing, more events that bring in funds for our operating budget (including facility use by community partners), and thus, have more income to our 2024 operating budget.

A copy of our current budget is available in our church library on the shelf above the computer. You are invited to look at it at any time in order to understand where our money is allocated. Please think hard about this decision and attend the church conference on October 10th to vote YES to use the endowment principle if needed or NO to not use it and make other cuts within our budget.

Summary:

What is the vote? If we receive the 2/3 majority of votes for yes, we will place the \$32,000 of Endowment Fund Principal along with about \$50,000 in Endowment Fund earnings in our 2024 budget as income to balance the budget.

If the majority vote is no, then our teams will need to make choices on what to cut in our budget. This will mainly affect SPRC and dramatic changes will occur to the way our church functions. Ultimately, the more money that can come in to support the 2024 budget, the less we will need to use from endowment earnings or the endowment principle.

What else can you do to help? Bring a friend to church, share our events and posts on Facebook, spread the word of our amazing mission and ministry programs, participate in our events, volunteer for anything that interests you.
