This Week's Message is Based on Luke 24:13-35 (the encounter on the Road to Emmaus)

It's one thing to know about Jesus, even to understand how all the pieces of Scripture fit together. The evidence is important, but it's never enough. At some point, you need that moment in which not only do you see, but you really see and you believe.

And that's what happened to these two. They stopped being confused. They understood the storyline, how things all fit together. And then their eyes were opened so that they recognized Jesus themselves.

The results: they went right back to Jerusalem. They regained their hope. They met with the disciples. Their lives were changed.

The Passing of Innocent P. Afful

It is with sadness that the General Board of Global Ministries announces the death of a Global Missionary in active service, Innocent P. Afful, who passed away on April 17, 2023. He served as a Global Missionary since 2014 with the Churches of Christ in the Congo, as coordinator for orphans and vulnerable children in Kinshasa, Democratic Republic of the Congo.

Roland Fernandes, general secretary of Global Ministries expressed sorrow at Afful's passing, "We are deeply saddened by this unexpected loss to our missionary family. Innocent was well known for his extensive and passionate missionary work in service of the most vulnerable. He worked tirelessly to share God's love with all."

Innocent was a native of Ghana and worked in social ministry both in his own country and in Liberia and Sierra Leone. He is a member of the Rev. J.C. Mensah Memorial Methodist Church in Accra. He is survived by his wife, Wilhemina M. Afful, and their three children, Charity, Ephraim and Jacobsen.

Did You Know ...

that annually, the United Methodist conference collects "Kits for Conference?" These are various emergency relief kits that are assembled for UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief). These relief supplies provide care for the most vulnerable following a disaster (hurricane, tornados, floods, etc.) or during times of crisis. UMCOR collects relief supplies in the form of Cleaning Bucket Kits, Hygiene Kits and new this year, Women's Hygiene Kits. These are assembled by United Methodist volunteers (like our church members) for distribution in the United States and its territories. Kits are taken to the UMCOR Sager Brown Depot in Baldwin, IL, the taken to the UMCOR Sager Brown Depot in Baldwin, IL, the hub of relief supply operations. The kits are checked before being stored, ready for use in the time of an emergency. Over the years, our church has provided School Kits (see the picture of packed boxes below which were assembled by the Barbara Liddick Circle ladies and our children with donations from church members), Cleaning Bucket Kits (see Lynn Stockberger in the picture below), Birthing Kits (see picture of the Mary Freeman Circle ladies below), and more. This year, our circle ladies have been assembling the new Women's Hygiene Kits and the church is invited to participate by Hygiene Kits and the church is invited to participate by adopting a Cleaning Bucket. Since annual conference this year is in Roanoke and the packaged buckets are hard for us to transport to Roanoke, we are able to do cash donations for the buckets. UMCOR purchases the supplies necessary and packages the buckets. You can "adopt a bucket" with a donation of \$75. 
