## This Week's Message is Based on John 10:1-10

Lets look at the beginning of this week's Gospel passage: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). Take just a moment and think about these two short sentences. Jesus is saying to his disciples (both then and now) that he is the good shepherd. There's no doubt, no question in his voice—just bold and clear, "I am the good shepherd." And what does this good shepherd do for his sheep, his followers, his disciples? He lays down his life for them. He lays down his life—for you and for me.

What have you done to deserve such a meaningful gift? What have you done to be worthy of someone laying down their life for you? In all honesty, nothing. Christ died for you and for me. Christ died for us hundreds of years before any of us were born, and he dies for us because he loves us.

Most of the time we are not truly worthy of having a savior like this. Sure, we have moments when we do the right thing. But imagine a world where we always did the right thing. Imagine a world where women and men, boys and girls, could get along, could work together for the common good and could live in peace and harmony. Can you even imagine that? The challenge for you today, tomorrow, and forever, is to live a life that is truly worthy of this unmerited, undeserved gift that our Lord and Savior has given to us.

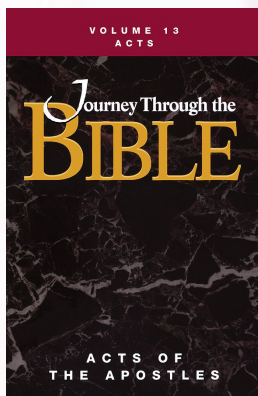

## Did You Know ...

that we have a number of "K Accounts" for Second Mile Giving opportunities? Why K Accounts? Well, no special reason, it was just the next line on the spreadsheet of the accounts so adopted the nick name "K Accounts." These are all the Second Mile Giving accounts for our church, most of them fall outside of budget line items, like Lenten/Advent offerings, Upward basketball, Senior Fellowship, Sunday School, Dinner Church and Meals on Monday. Others are extensions of our budget for ministry programs like Vacation Bible School, Rise Against Hunger, Red Bird, THRIVE, and more. When we do a special offering collection, for example, the Fellowship Hall Kitchen Refurbish account, it will go into a "K Account" and we keep track of the funds donated to that special offering. These are called "Second Mile Gifts" as they are outside of the annual budget income for us to maintain the main facility of our church, the home of all of these mission and ministry programs. Copies of our 2023 budget and list of K Accounts as of the end of March, 2023, are available in the white notebook in the library.

The Fellowship Hall Kitchen is one K Account that was recently started to help with an eventual update to the kitchen. Back in 1967, the small congregation of WMUMC had grown, so there was a real need for more classrooms, a large Fellowship Hall and a kitchen. Now, at 56 years old, there is a need for many upgrades to be done. It is regularly used for both the Meals on Mondays lunch program and Wednesday night Dinner Church, United Methodist Men cooking peanuts, as well as for funeral receptions and other church gatherings. It is unknown at this time the amount of funds that are needed to help with improvements, but, it is something we will slowly work Towards, along with the AVL upgrade for the Celebration Center, new HVAC units throughout the church, new windows in the older section of the facility, new carpeting throughout the majority of the church halls, and more. So, if you have a little extra money, or you sell some items you no longer need and want to put the funds to a good cause, take a look at our list of accounts to see what you might like to help contribute towards. As an example, one member recently sold a few things on Facebook Marketplace and gave the money to our Lenten/Easter offering for the people of Turkey after the recent earthquakes. If you would like to know more about these accounts, feel free to talk with our finance chair, Jim Corliss.

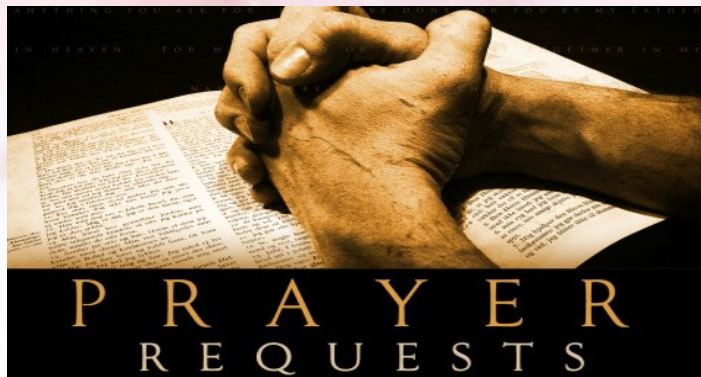

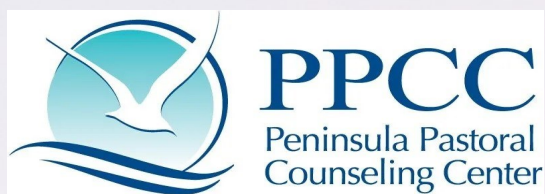




## 5th Sunday Fellowship April 30th
